Hilburn v. Enerpipe LTD., & its potential impact on Health Care in Kansas

On June 14, 2019 the Kansas Supreme Court issued its opinion in *Hilburn v. Enerpipe LTD* and struck down the statutory cap on non-economic damages in personal injury cases as set forth in K.S.A. 60-19a02. In this session, Mr. Scott will provide a high-level overview of the Court's decision and discuss a number of troubling decision factors identified in several of the justices' rendered opinions. Mr. Scott will then transition the discussion to the potential impacts the *Hilburn* decision could have on access to quality health care for Kansans.
